The Walker Sculpture Garden is a Minneapolis landmark that offers impeccable views of downtown. A variety of events are offered throughout the year. Paddleford Riverboats	Kick back and let the river set your imagination adrift while riding in a vintage paddleboat. Paddleford Riverboats dock on beautiful Harriet Island, just across the Mississippi River from downtown St. Paul. The skyline views are breathtaking, but the chance to see bald eagles nesting downriver is even better. Be sure to bring your binoculars.
