

While you're here, pull up a stool in the cafe and listen to stories of legend and lore from locals. Zoo Montana	With the perfect blend of native and exotic animals, your little beasts will love getting up close and personal with nature. The only zoo of its kind for some 500 miles, this 70-acre park hosts more than 70,000 visitors a year. Admission is \$6.25 for adults, \$3.25 for children ages 3-15 and seniors pay just \$4.25.	http://www.zoomontana.org
Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument	Take in the sites of one of the most significant battles in American History. Known as 'Custer's Last Stand', in 1876, 263 soldiers were killed in combat with several thousand Lakota and Cheyenne warriors. Admission is \$10 per vehicle, \$5 for pedestrians and motorcycles.	http://www.nps.gov/libi
Billings Mustangs Baseball	A rookie-league affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds, the Mustangs host family-friendly games throughout the summer at pristine Dehler Park. Enjoy America's Favorite Pastime in the shadows of the Rocky Mountains. Tickets range from \$8 to \$11.	http://billings.mustangs.milb.com
Yellowstone National Park	Teddy Roosevelt declared Yellowstone the first National Park in 1872. Home to hundreds of varieties of wildlife - elk, bison, grizzly bears and wolves - the park also is home to the 'Old Faithful' geyser, which spouts boiling hot water every 45 minutes to 2 hours. Drive through the park yourself or enjoy a guided bus tour. Prices range from \$29 to \$68 per person. Or see the park via horseback or llama.	http://www.nps.gov/yell

Golden Spike Historical Site	Perhaps one of the most under-appreciated historical spots in America, the Golden Spike represents the moment the country connected. See steam locomotives, similar to the engines that powered across the Plains more than 140 years ago. Vehicle admission fee is \$7, seven days a week. Museum of Ancient Life	Come stomp around the former stomping grounds of dinosaurs and other prehistoric beasts. The Museum of Ancient Life features an expansive collection of dinosaur bones and even allows your little diggers to search for fossils of their own. Tabernacle of Temple Square	This dome-like structure towers over Salt Lake City and is home to the world-renowned Mormon Tabernacle Choir. The uplifting beauty of this building will leave you inspired and singing a new tune as you continue on your way across Utah.
